Courses and Thesis/Dissertation Committees

Courses at the University of Washington:

Sociology 504 (previously Soc 424) (Statistical Analysis for Social Scientists Part I): First in a three-series required graduate sequence. The course introduces descriptive and inferential statistics. Statistical tests of simple univariate and bivariate (e.g. differences in means, crosstabulations, ANOVA, regression/correlations) are covered. Multivariate regression is introduced.

Sociology 505 (previously Soc 425) (Statistical Analysis for Social Scientists Part II): Second in a three-series required graduate sequence. The course covers in detail regression, multiple regression, and logistic regression including diagnosing and correcting for common problems in these models (e.g. outliers, correlated error). Simple recursive structural equation modeling is introduced.

Sociology 506 (CSSS 507). Third in a three-series required graduate sequence. The course covers in detail regression in cross-sectional time series designs, fixed and random effects models, and models for limited dependent variables.

Sociology 525 (Multiple Indicators in the Social Sciences): Graduate course (team taught w/H.M Blalock and w/H.L. Costner). Introduction to problems of measurement in the social sciences and models incorporating latent variable strategies to address these issues.

Sociology 528 (Special Issues in Research Methods): Graduate course covering two current topics in research. The course addresses contextual or multi-level model design/analysis and longitudinal data analysis of panel or pooled time-cross-sectional designs including latent growth curve models.

Sociology 529/CSSS 526 (Structural Equation Models): Graduate course in structural equation models including use of latent variable models. Course includes confirmatory factor analyses, growth modeling, and other uses of structural models.

Courses at Stanford University:

Sociology 144 (Stratification and Social Mobility): Undergraduate survey course. Study of the distribution of social rewards and resources. Examines theories of stratification and explores historical trends and current reward/resource distributions by class, race, and gender.

Sociology 150 (The Family): Undergraduate survey course. Emphasis is on historical and recent trends in family composition, organization and processes. Western societies are examined and compared with current situations in developing countries.

Sociology 249 (Social Demography): Upper-level undergraduate course in social demography. Examines basic changes in mortality, morbidity, and fertility in the developed and developing world. Emphasis is on the interplay of social and demographic factors on basic demographic changes (e.g. life expectancy, teenage fertility) and their link to social structures (e.g. marriage patterns, labor force composition, kinship patterns).

Sociology Sophomore Seminar (Social Demography and Health): This course was developed as part of a competitive, university initiative to provide sophomores with special seminar topics and educational opportunity. The course is designed to explore the relation between demographic factors and health outcomes. The course will examine historical changes in mortality and morbidity and examine the relation between medicine, public health, and social structure to these outcomes.

Sociology 381 (Introduction to Research Design and Statistical Inference): First course in the graduate student program. Course provides basic research design elements and introduction to statistical inference. Course includes an additional section on computers and software for statistical analyses.

Sociology 382 (Introduction to the General Linear Model): Second course in the required graduate student statistics/methods program. Course provides introduction to regression and multiple regression and to loglinear and logistic models.

Sociology 384 (Advanced Quantitative Outcomes): Fourth course in the required graduate student statistics/methods program. Course covers general and advanced topics in multiple regression, structural equation modeling with latent variables, time-series and pooled time-series models, and mathematical models.

Sociology 385 (Measurement in the Social Sciences): Graduate seminar on the principles and problems of measurement in the social sciences. Methodological approaches to solving these problems, including questionnaire design and statistical models to assess measurement error.

Sociology 389 (Workshop in Research Design and Methods): Course in research design. The workshop included detailed reviews of graduate student dissertation projects and lectures on advance topics (e.g. models of missing data, hierarchical/contextual models).
